## Security Issues

A noteworthy attraction of VFTS is our 24 hour security. The security staff welcomes visitors, accepts deliveries, answers phone calls and responds to complaints. Periodically, the guard makes "rounds" to check exit and stairwell doors. Sometimes they have to go to the resident floors to respond to a complaint or problem.

This means that the front desk is not always staffed. There may be an occasion when a resident calls 911 for assistance and the guard is away from the desk when police arrive and therefore cannot give the resident's key to the officers. Keys are kept for maintenance emergencies and not everyone leaves a key in the office. Staff will always try to help but access assistance in a medical emergency is not guaranteed. This is a dilemma we are trying to address. Thanks to Greg Waks we learned of a township program, LOCK for LIFE. A brochure will be placed in mailboxes with this newsletter and will be posted on the bulletin board. The name of the officer in charge is written on the brochure as well as the phone number and web site for more information.

Security is a group effort. Anyone with an entrance FOB can use the front or back entrances, but please ask your visitors or guests to use the front entrance via the call box or sign in procedure.

### **Balcony** update

Many residents continue to struggle hiring someone to remove the carpeting from their balcony and the replacement tiles that allow free flow of water are nowhere to be found in stores or online.
