This editor's personal journey- In 2018 the Council at the time passed a policy that every owner must install a water alarm/ shut off system on the hot water tank in their unit. After all, while VFTS replaces tanks every 10 years, they can break and leak causing damage to units below and an insurance deductible charge to the unit owner. I thought it was a great idea and planned to have one installed right away. I never got around to it. The following year they announced a new policy in response to owner feedback. That is, that owners must install, at their expense, when new tanks are installed, a water alarm/shut off system. In the meantime, every owner had the option of having one installed immediately. I still thought it was a great idea and planned to have one installed right away. I never got around to it.

After hearing some horror stories, in January, I finally got around to it. Within a week of contacting the office, Elmer and Don came to my unit, installed the system in about an hour, I was charged \$260 for parts, no charge for labor. Now I have peace of mind. Elections

Another annual rite of spring is elections for VFTS Condominium Council and Community Association Board. There are 3 positions open on the VFTS Council, two 2 year positions and one 1 year position.

The Community Association Board has 3 openings, 1 two year term, 1 one year term and alternate.

VFTS Council members have at least one meeting a month, study information and communication between meetings and take on special projects such as meeting with structural engineers, publishing a newsletter, finance/budget committee, and the like. The time commitment averages about 30 hours a month.

Community Association members attend one meeting a month, study information and communication between meetings, serve on committees, and post meeting minutes on the CA Bulletin Board. On a rotating basis they attend part of VFTS Council meetings to share CA issues and get feedback. The time commitment averages about 8 hours a month.
