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Urgent Alert

Owner's are responsible for the actions of anyone who does renovations in their units. Before the first screwdriver is in hand, your renovation plans and Cerificates of Insurance must be on file in the

Manager's office. Permits must also be on file with Upper Merion Township. Owners will be held responsible if contractors do not follow appropriate procedures such as trash disposal or if they do any damage to commom areas such as the elevator or hallways.

They will be checking for potential leaks in hoses and faucets, inspecting the AC system and changing filters. Please be sure your balcony storage has a clear path to the AC. Projects Progressing

□ We have contracted with Swartly Brothers Engineers to install a Disconnect Switch in the Main Outdoor Substation. The need for the new switch was discovered during a routine transformer inspection. That is the good news, the bad news is that the equipment is ordered and may take eight weeks to arrive. We have Swartly Brothers on speed dial and they assure us that if there is a malfunction in the interim, they can restore power in a few hours.

Residents have complained about the height of the guard desk for years. One of the first goals of this council was to lower the desk. Naïvly, we thought we could just lop off a few inches. We learned that we know nothing about the structure or wiring of a functional piece of furniture. We had design specs drawn up and contacted contractors and cabinet makers for bids. Still waiting for someone to come in with a reasonable price and time frame!

☐ We know the package delivery system here is onerous and unsecure. Our office contacted four companies for bids to remodel the package room to a locker style room with electronic notification system. Council member Nimesh Shah and manager Kelly Cabell are going to review the proposals and make a recommendation to the Council.
